

#### **English academic writing** workshop July 11-12, 2016 Universitat Pompeu Fabra

This workshop provides practical training in the requirements and conventions of good English academic writing. It addresses some of the particular problems of formal English for speakers of Spanish, and helps participants to write according to the appropriate academic standards required for top-tier accounting research journals.
